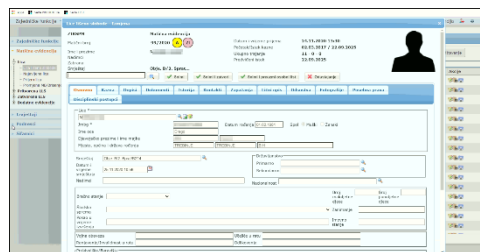
The project was initiated in 2008 by the Ministry of Justice of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through a dedicated Project Implementation Unit, with grant and loan support from the WBIF, as well as contributions from (national) IPA 2008 and 2010, Sweden and the United States. All WBIF grant support to date has been provided by the EU through the Infrastructure Project Facility. It is the first maximum-security prison in Bosnia and Herzegovina to fully comply with European Prison Rules. The prison building has been officially opened on 22/07/2020

The Grant Application WB14-BIH-SOC-01 is divided into 3 components:

- Component 1: Technical Assistance in design supervision and project implementation, which has been completed and was implemented through IPF3;
- Component 2: Development and installation of a Management Information System software (MIS);
- Component 3: Training of prison staff in accordance with the European Prison Rules (EPR).

Component 2 - MIS:

The overall objective was to provide a prison Management Information System which will allow the State Prison to perform its management functions.



The scope was to provide a 24/7 accessible integrated and standardized software application for the prison Management Information System, including analysing, designing, developing, configuring implementing and maintaining the MIS.

Component 3 - Training:

The overall objective was to provide TA services in order to have trained state prison staff, of all grades, ranks and specialisms, who can apply new knowledge and skills in the area of the prison system, acting humanely and with the highest standards in accordance with the European Convention on Human Rights.



This activity was divided into three separate stages, including development of training programmes, delivery of training to trainers and Assistance with the delivery of Training to Staff. It was implemented over a 6 months period ending in December 2020.

Benefits of the project:

- technological (software) basis for adequate administrative management
- trained staff in prison for carrying out prisoners policies in accordance with European Convention on Human Rights
- securing social confidence at the State Administration by being able to enforce sentences for war criminals, organised crimes etc. within the country which means trained staff in Prison for carrying out prisoners policies in accordance with the European Convention on Human Rights
