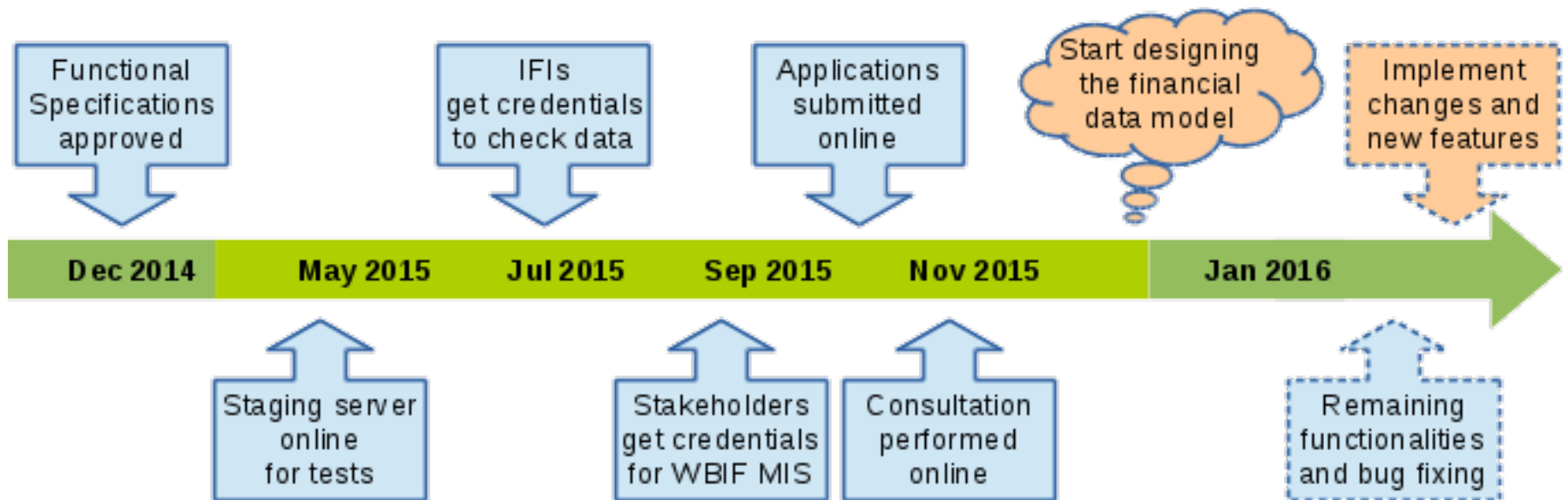


Design philosophy

Issues and effective User support

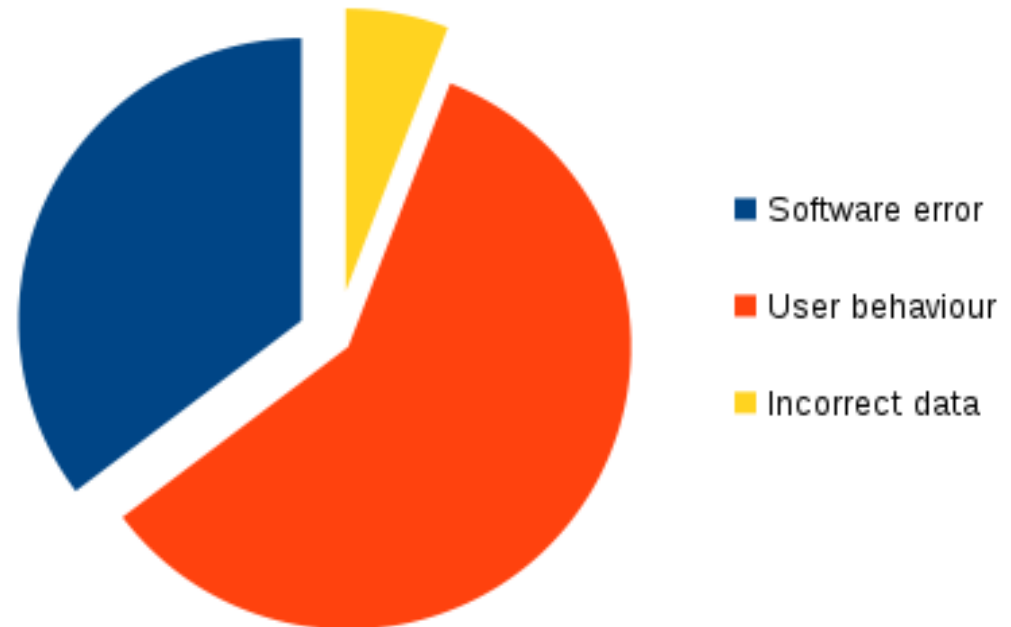
- Inevitable difficulties were expected:
 - Innovations introduced at data model
 - and operations level
 - Young maturity of the software
 - Limited use of the Testing Server
- Rapid reaction of the user support team
- No significant disruption of normal operations

- **Software errors:**
- no one is perfect
- **Incorrect data:**
- migration mistakes,
- incomplete data
- in the old DB
- **User behaviour:**
- new model, new tool

Functionalities implemented

- Browsing, filtering, searching data

Remaining functionalities to come

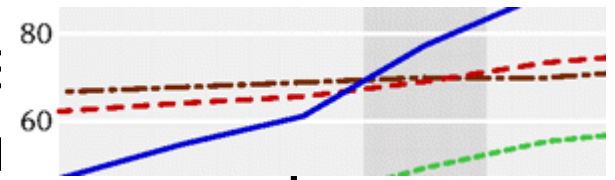
- Workflows:

- Continuous bug fixing and quality assurance



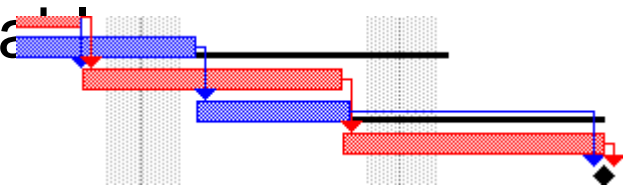
Roadmap
