- → Kriva Palanka Bulgarian Border, 23.4 km



Flagship 1 **Connecting East to West**

The investment project for the section Beljakovce - Kriva Palanka concerns the rehabilitation of 34 km of CVIII railway track to modern standards. The planned development includes several railway bridges, over and underpasses, 5.5 km-long tunnels, railway stations and halts, and a new signaling and telecommunication system. This WBIF project is included in the Economic and Investment Plan for the Western Balkans 2021-2027, under Flagship 1 "Connecting East to West" (Sustainable Transport).
